



PROPERTY OWNER FED UP WITH OFF-TRAIL TRESPASSERS!

SECTION OF TOP TRAIL C CLOSED IN CONISTON.

Coniston Wahnapiatae Driftbusters's fences cut, opened by snowmobile trespassers. The C trail from the RAILWAY CROSSING of EDWARD AVE SOUTH (near Colonial Inn) to south past the GOLF COURSE to ALICE LAKE IS NOW CLOSED to ALL MOTORIZED VEHICLES.

The vandalism and trespass in Coniston will immediately impact tourism entering Coniston from Central Ontario along the C trail including the original routing of this year's Snowarama out of the Colonial Inn (Feb 6 2016), the original routing maps and runs for the Royal Flush Poker Run southern leg (Feb 13 2016), and change the CWDriftbusters planned Family Hot Dog-Hot Chocolate Day on the trail.

Reminder: Trespass to Property Act in Ontario exempts farms under cultivation, tree farms, fields of maintained lawns - like football and soccer fields and golf courses- from having to fence or post signs because anyone smart enough to pass a motor vehicle license should be able to recognize a golf course or a playing field. If you are dumb enough to trespass and drive there, you can be arrested and held for police by the owner or their agents, you or the owner of the machine can pay up to a \$2000 fine for trespassing, up to \$1000 for the damages you caused, prosecution court costs, and Victims of Crime Surcharge. The owner can elect not to take the \$1000 in damages, and drag you to civil court to recover greater damages. The trespass to property is a growing issue, and government is debating changes to make a minimum fine of \$500, and to allow the damages collected to be a maximum of \$25,000. So Don't Trespass.
